Mr. Plaza read his reports.

The A&P received a Notice of Violation because they failed to separate recyclable material from the solid waste. The State of NJ is requiring the County to strictly enforce the recycling laws. They did receive a satisfactory rating.

The Farmers Market received a satisfactory rating upon inspection.

New Taste Restaurant received a conditional rating upon inspection. There will be a re-inspection.

Wantage Citgo received a satisfactory rating.

Quick Chek received a Notice of Violation for a recycling infraction.

Preliminary approval was given for a hot dog cart to be placed in the Anderson Garden Center's parking lot.

A home on Sally Harden Road needed to relocate the septic tank after it failed an inspection during a resale.

A new well line was installed on Lower Unionville Road. The property was sold when the well was partially complete.

The County Health Department sent a letter to the State of NJ on behalf of Clove Manor. The pool does not meet the safety requirements. The State would not waive the requirements. The pool can not operate without a main drain.

A Certificate of Compliance was issued to a house on Appalachian Road.

There was a dog bite at 11 Lakeview Dr. The dog has since been released from quarantine.

Too much water and re-grading of properties on Mudtown Road has caused neighbor disagreements. The resident of 173 Mudtown Road is concerned her new septic will be ruined by the additional water that may be diverted on to her property when 171 Mudtown installs a pool. All the proper permits have been taken out. The courts may be the one to decide on the final outcome.
